Dear Sirs,

Re: The Hamilton Laing Nature Park.

In reply to your letter, and after meeting with Alderman Bullen and Richardson on April 11, the Comox-Strathcona Natural History Society wishes to look after the property as a small park, in cooperation with the Parks Committee, and would like to recommend the following:

(1) That the property Boundaries be fenced on the east, and a natural hedge or tree boundary be established on the west perimeter.

(2) That no horses, or motor traffic, (unless authorized by the town) be allowed.

(3) That no fires or camping be allowed.

(4) That foot paths be laid out, so visitors could walk through the property to observe its natural beauty.

(5) Over the next year, the N.H.S. will make an inventory of all the flora and fauna in the area.

The Comox-Strathcona Natural History Society would be interested in the opportunity to supervise the implementation of the above recommendations. All recommendations would have to be approved by the Parks Committee of the Town of Comox.

The Town of Comox is indeed fortunate to have been given this beautiful property. Its value as a natural park within the town boundaries cannot be overestimated. Because of this feature alone, tourists who would otherwise bypass Comox, will be attracted to the area.
